


PACIFIC LOGGING 2024 ANNUAL REPORT

Scholarship funds the PFF has awarded in the past three years




Number of students who received scholarships in 2024

TAKING PART IN REGIONAL CONFERENCES

This year members of the Pacific Logging Congress have been making appearances at our sister conferences — Oregon Logging Conference, Sierra Cascade, Redding Regional and the IntermountainLogging Conference.

It's been fun and educational to see what amazing events and work is taking place by organizations spanning the greater Northwest.

The Oregon Logging Conference kicked things of with another great event. In addition to full fairground of equipment, they hosted more than 700 Oregon students from more than 30 schools as educators, and industry professionals joined forces at the Future Forestry Workers Career Day. And the Oregon Women in Timber raised over \$146,00 for their educational programs during a sellout dinner.

Next up was the Sierra Cascade Logging Conference. President Hunter Harrill says, "The SCLC was well attended as usual. The auction banquet was the largest I have ever seen, and their logging sports competition has grown significantly to 10 schools competing and pro timbersports competitors (e.g. world champions) providing coaching sessions to student competitors."

Diane Mettler, who had a Pacific Forest Foundation booth at the Redwood Regional Conference, was equally



impressed with that event. "There were kids everywhere taking in the equipment and learning about the industry. They even got to go on a steam engine ride. And no one was stopped by the rain."

She adds, "The dinner and auction were amazing. And who wouldn't enjoy a Gin Fizz breakfast, with keynote speaker Mike Albrecht President of the ALC. But what I really enjoyed was the wonderful group that put it on. It was a joy to get to meet some of them."

Of note, this year the Intermountain Loggers council is not only putting on its annual conference, but later this month is assisting with a local in-woods



show. They anticipate bringing 350 students a day to the event. The PLC is supplying hard hats for the students and wish them luck on this first-ever event.

FORESTRY CHALLENGE UPDATE

The Forestry Challenge was the subject of a 30-minute presentation to the California Board of Forestry on January 22. I was thrilled to be able to feature four teams in this presentation, one from each of the fall event locations that had high presentation scores. I summarized our 2024 accomplishments and the teams presented information on their focus topic. The Board had a few questions at the end of the presentation and were very complimentary of the students. They set the stage for increased funding to enhance and expand the Forestry Challenge in the years ahead.

Championship Event

The top 20% of teams from the fall events will gather in Pinecrest (near Yosemite) on April 23 to 25 for the Forestry Challenge Championships. Teams from all over California will compete in a fast-paced competition which will include a conceptually advanced focus topic. Scoring is reversed from the fall events, with 60% weight for the final presentation and 40% weight given to the



field test. Bejac is generously sponsoring the t-shirts for the event.

Fall Event Recruiting

Forestry Challenge staff has been hard at work recruiting schools for the fall 2025 events taking place in the Shasta, Santa Cruz, El Dorado, and San Bernardino regions. We recently exhibited at a Career and Technical Education
