DECEMBER 18 LIVE STREAMING AUCTION

- Ritchie Bros. suggests you post your maximum bid prior to the 18th, as bidding will happen extremely quickly on the 18th. Note: Your maximum bid works just like Ebay you won't pay the full maximum bid unless bidding works its way up there.



EDUCATION COMMITTEE UPDATE

This year has been challenging for all of us in the forestry sector, with complications due to COVID. As many of you know, providing educational support to schools, government and the general public, is a key role of the Pacific Logging Congress (PLC). Annually, the PLC and their membership, provide numerous opportunities for schools and the public to learn more about the forest industry through the Live in the Woods Shows, Adopt a High School Program, field trips, school visits, tours, and more. However, this year teachers have also experienced significant hurdles in delivering a positive and meaningful educational experience for their students, since many of these opportunities for students to see forestry in action or to talk with professionals have been curtailed. The PLC Education Committee saw these challenges as opportunities to further support our educators and the next generation of aspiring forest professionals. To provide support, the PLC Education Committee has developed two new educational resources: The Pacific Forest Foundation (PFF) educational videos web page and the PFF Interactive Teaching Map.

The PFF educational videos web page is up and running and will continue to



grow over time, so check it out (https://www.pacificforestfoundation.org/blog). The web page features many good quality, short educational videos about different aspects of the forest industry (e.g. Forestry, Sustainability, Careers). The videos collated on the web page have been generously provided from many different industry partners and organizations. If you know of more good quality educational videos that we should include on the web page, we would like to hear from you.

The PFF Interactive Teaching Map is another initiative that aims to provide educators with specific topics about forestry and was created by our own PLC membership. Basically, it's like a Google Map, where users can scroll around to click on different icons on the map. When an icon is clicked it brings up some media resources, like a

short video or photo album, and a short article discussing what's being observed in the media.

The Interactive Teaching Map also represents a great opportunity for the PLC to showcase its breadth and diverse membership, by showing where we are all located (worldwide) and the variety of things we do! The Interactive Teaching Map idea has gained lots of traction from both the industry and educators, so a new web page is in the process of being developed to host these materials.

Currently, the Education Committee is requesting content from PLC members. If you have a short video or photos of something you do (e.g. a short video of your business) that would be interesting for students or the public to see, let us know. All that's required is your location so we can create an icon on the map, some form of media, and a short description which we are happy to help you with.

Please help us continue educating others about forestry during these challenging times.
