HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 116TH PACIFIC LOGGING CONGRESS

The 116th Pacific Logging Congress (PLC) was held November 2–5, 2025, at the La Quinta Resort in sunny La Quinta, California. Attendees enjoyed excellent networking opportunities and a wealth of information from an outstanding lineup of speakers.

It was truly an international gathering, as PLC President Hunter Harrill and his wife Katie welcomed participants from across the U.S., as well as from New Zealand and British Columbia.

Receptions

The first event of the week was a casual "early arrivers" reception hosted by President Hunter Harrill and his wife Katie, which quickly spilled onto their patio. Colleagues reconnected, sharing good food, drinks, and stories.

The following day featured the Past Presidents and Spouses Breakfast, the General Board Meeting, and an outdoor Opening Reception. Conversation flowed well into the evening as members enjoyed a relaxed and inviting atmosphere.

Speakers



Oregon Logging Conference

The 88th Oregon Logging Conference will be held February 19-21, 2026, at the Lane Event Center & Fairgrounds in Eugene, Oregon.

The Keynote Speaker will be Jacque Buchanan, Regional Forester for the U.S Forest Service (USFS) Pacific Northwest Region (Region 6 – Oregon



& Washington). Her Adress will cover recent U.S. Forest Service changes affecting logging, noting that new USFS goals to boost harvests and reduce fuel loads support the OLC theme of Responsible Forestry Today, Healthy Forests Tomorrow.

As always, the OLC program will provide valuable information presented by knowledgeable speakers. And remember, those who attend the OLC equipment show, and program sessions qualify for Professional Logger Continuing Education Credits.

Business seminars will include CPR/ First Aid, Fire School/RT-130 Refresher Course, and Advanced Driver Safety. Hand's-on seminars include a Log Rollout including scaling and mismanufacturing of logs and a Walk-Around Truck and Brake Safety Inspection.

The Your Voice – Your Vote seminar will have speakers talking about the importance and critical influence of voting on natural resource issues.

Friday Morning Forestry Talks will focus on the Private Forest Accord and a discussion of how counties and Oregonians benefit from public land management, specifically timber harvesting. Also on Friday there is a Washington Forest Practices Act seminar.

This marks the first time the conference will be hosted in the Victorian Village of Ferndale — an iconic community shaped by the craftsmanship and legacy of the timber industry.




The conference will be led by RRLC President Jesse Crosswhite of CW Wood Products, whose leadership and commitment to our industry will help guide this milestone.
